

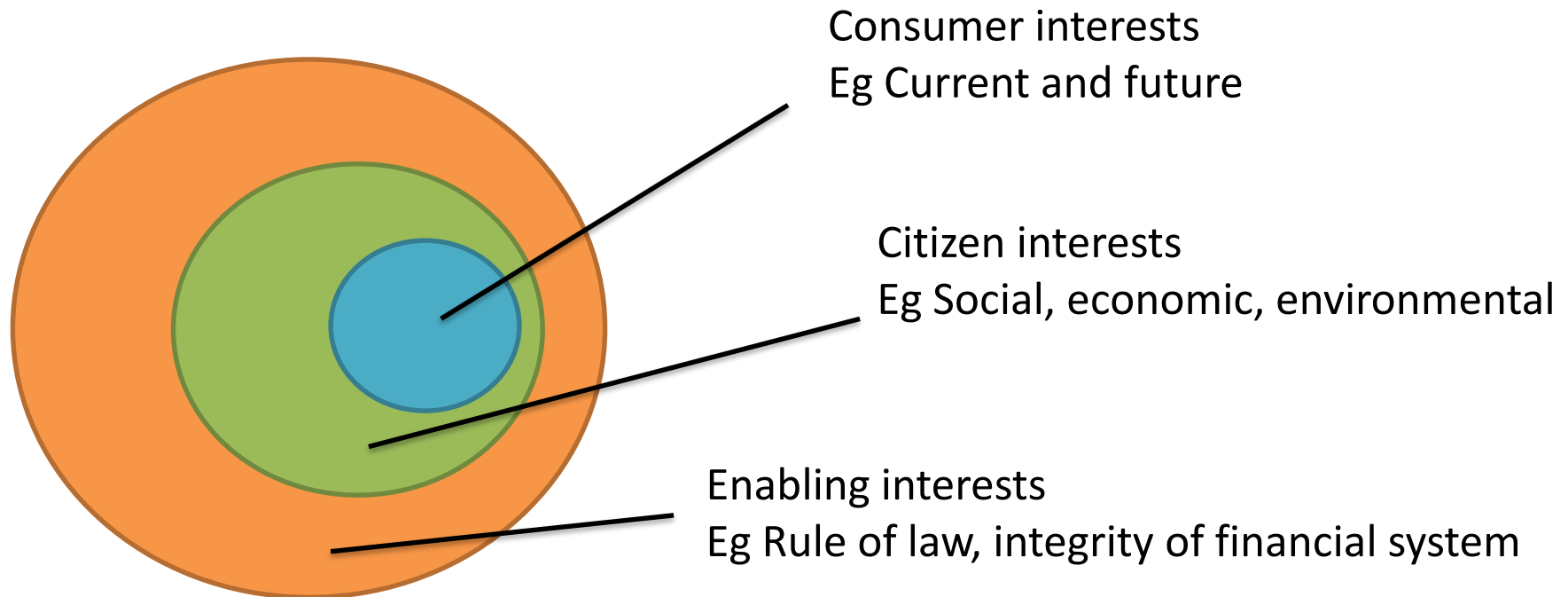

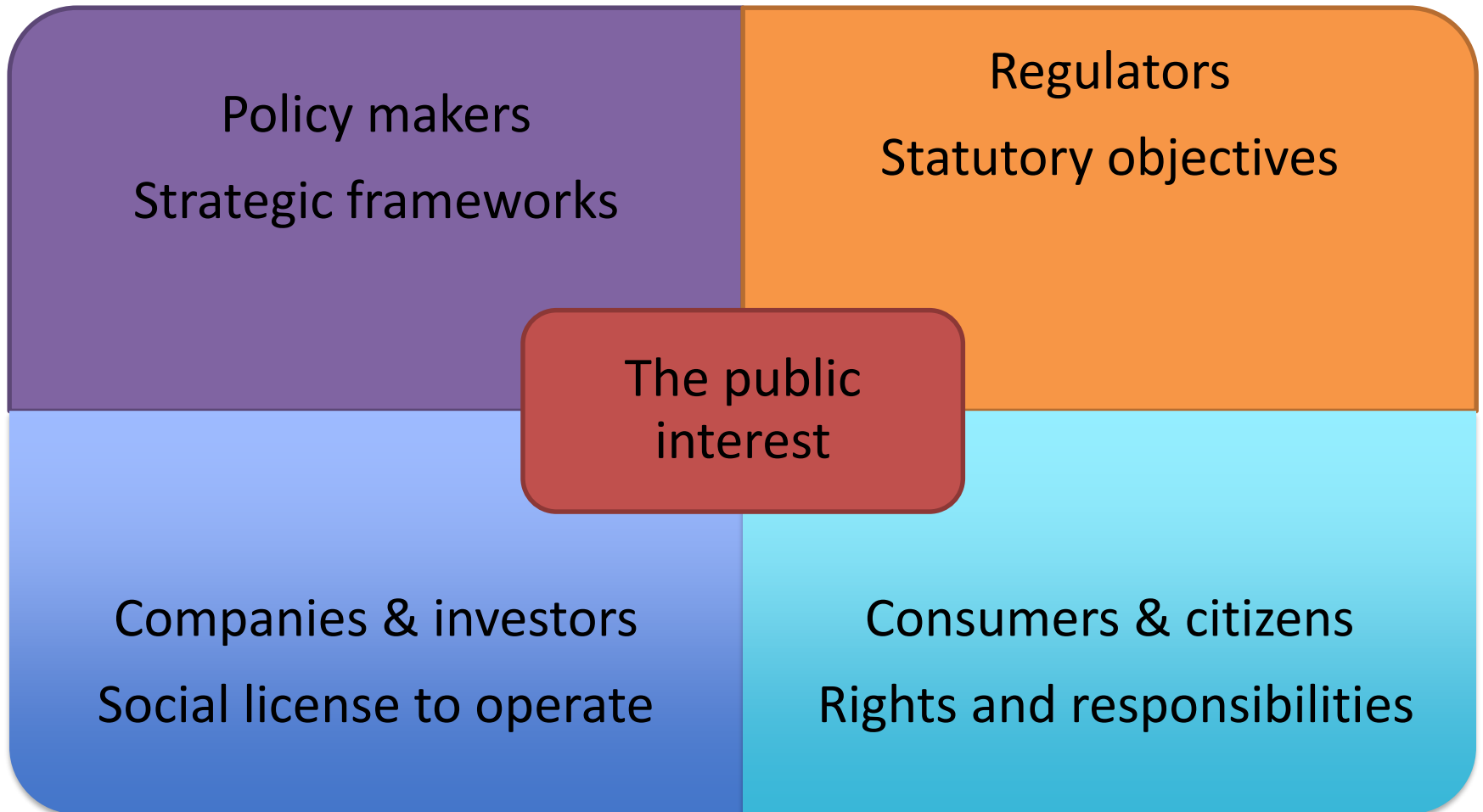

## The New Energy and Water Public Interest Network (New-Pin)



- Network of stakeholders with an interest in energy and water
- Consumer, citizen, environmental, government, regulatory & company representatives
- Aims
  - To develop clearer alignment and better understanding of what the **long-term** public interest looks like in energy & water
  - To develop capacity and expertise amongst public interest groups working in the sectors
  - To improve understanding amongst regulatory and company boards of the long-term public interest and the value of public engagement in energy and water
